DON'T BRING FIREWOOD INTO SOUTH DAKOTA!

Exotic insects like Emerald Ash Borer are a major threat to South Dakota's trees. Such pests are easily spread to new areas when infested firewood is brought from other states.

If you or someone you know is planning a trip to South Dakota:

- Don't bring firewood from out-of-state
- Use South Dakota sources of firewood
